


MATT SURTEES

Not all players are the same level, so you need to stay patient and most of all make it enjoyable and encourage them to keep believing. To any up-and-coming coaches my best piece of advice is don't be afraid to make mistakes as it's how you learn.

Over the years I've had a great group of players, as well as parents and have had a very successful time. We were the first grassroots team to be invited to an England FA Tournament called ACES which is an invitation only Tournament. We played at Man Utd, Man City, Leeds United, Barnsley, Doncaster, Sheffield Wednesday, Sheffield United, Harrogate Town and on each off these occasions had great feedback.

These are reasons I got into coaching to give players chance to play at these types of venues. For some coaches it's about trophies, but for me it's seeing the looks on players faces when you arrive at these places, building a memory they will treasure and be able to tell friends and family when they're older. I'd love to be sat in a beer garden and an explayer walking in seeing me and coming over with a drink and saying thank you for what you did for me. I've had 17 players sign pro at clubs and to this day 14 are still with these clubs with one of them costing Man Utd 75k at just the age of 13.
